



## Emissions Testing Means Cleaner Air!



### 2015 TUCSON METROPOLITAN AREA Important Emissions Testing Information

Most 2011 and newer model year vehicles do not require testing.

Vehicles newer than 1966, but older than 2011, must be tested and must pass the emissions test in order to be registered in the State of Arizona.

Pima County inspections, except for On-Board Diagnostic (OBD) tests, are not valid for registration in Maricopa County.

**Emission testing is required for vehicles registered within designated emission control areas. If your vehicle has not previously required an emission test, is registered outside the area or in a zip code crossing the area boundary ("Code 52"), please visit [myAZcar.com](http://myAZcar.com) to determine if testing is required using the Address Locator Tool. ### GETTING READY FOR YOUR TEST Everything You Need To Know Before You Go

**If you participate in an insurance program that monitors your vehicle's operating data, be aware that you must remove the "Data Logger" from your vehicle's Data Link Connector; which is the vehicle's computer connector. (The connector is usually located under the dashboard). Emissions personnel will not remove or return data logger to the data link connector.**

Warm up the vehicle's engine before you arrive.

An overheated engine may cause your vehicle to fail. To avoid overheating while waiting, keep the engine running and, while in neutral or park, occasionally rev the engine for 15 seconds at a time. Turn off your air conditioner. Please do not bring passengers or pets.

Most vehicles will be driven by station personnel. You will be required to move to a passenger seat or exit the vehicle.

Trailers need to be removed from vehicles prior to entering the station property.

Vehicles must be able to enter the station under their own power.

1996 and newer OBD tested vehicles will not pass the test if the check engine light is on. It is advisable to have a professional determine the reason for the light being illuminated.

Repairs made up to 60 days prior to the initial failure may be creditable toward a waiver.

This facility is the only testing station that  
can accommodate heavy duty trucks over  
13 feet in height.
- **3931 N. Business Center Dr. –  
Waiver/Referee Station**  
Northwest of West Prince Rd. and I-10  
Lanes 1 and 2 are OBD express lanes for faster service.

## EMISSIONS TEST FEES With Many Payment Options

### \$12.25

Every other year for 1996 and newer model year vehicles with a Gross Vehicle Weight Rating (GVWR) of 8,500 pounds or less.  
**Check your vehicle registration renewal form to determine if your vehicle needs to be tested this year or call 1-877-692-9227.**

### \$12.25

Every year for 1967 through 1995 model year vehicles with a GVWR of 8,500 pounds or less, and 1967 and newer model year diesel vehicles and heavy duty vehicles with a GVWR greater than 8,500 pounds.

Payment may be made by **cash, check, credit** or **debit card**. (Visa, Mastercard and AMEX)

Checks must have an imprinted name and physical in-state address (not P.O. box), made payable to: **Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ)**.  
A valid driver's license or other official photo identification is required.

No refunds will be given if you take your car to be tested and you were not required to do so. **Check the Emissions Testing Required section of your registration renewal notice to determine if your car needs to be tested this year or call 1-877-692-9227.**

## IF YOUR VEHICLE FAILS What Should You Do Next?

**If your vehicle fails an initial test** or a paid re-test, you have the right to a free re-test if you return within 60 days and provide the repair information requested on the back of the vehicle inspection report.

**If your vehicle fails two tests**, you may be eligible for a repair waiver for a fee of \$15. This repair waiver is valid for the current vehicle registration only. Once a waiver is granted, the vehicle is not eligible for future emissions testing waivers.

Before making necessary repairs, many vehicles have specific warranty provisions for emissions related repairs. Check your owner's manual, emissions control warranty information pamphlet, or your dealer for information on whether your vehicle has warranty coverage.
