DRAFT HAZARDOUS WASTE PARTIAL CLOSURE PLAN

Notice is hereby given by the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) that Clean Harbors Arizona, L.L.C. (CHA), has submitted to ADEQ a draft partial Closure Plan for two hazardous waste storage tanks. The tanks are located on the CHA property at 1340 West Lincoln Street, Phoenix, AZ, 85007. The plan can be viewed at ADEQ from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm (M-F), excluding holidays. The two 10,150-gallon above ground storage tanks were used to consolidate and store hazardous waste bulk liquids prior to shipment offsite for recycling, treatment, or disposal. They were used to primarily store flammable, non-flammable, and toxic hazardous wastes.

The partial Closure Plan would allow the facility to close the two tanks and remove them from CHA's operations. The tanks were emptied, cleaned, and inspected in 2009. Due to market demands, CHA elected to close the tanks rather than repair or replace them. The plan describes procedures for decontamination, sampling, laboratory analysis to verify clean, dismantling, disposal and/or recycling for steel values, and preparation for off-site transport. Inspection and possible repair of the existing tank farm secondary containment is included.

Up through August 31, 2011, the public may submit written comments, request changes to the plan, or request a public hearing. Any comments or requests must be sent to Anthony Leverock, Hazardous Waste Permits Unit, ADEQ, 1110 W. Washington St., Phoenix, AZ, 85007. Requests for a public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised at the hearing. A public hearing may be held if ADEQ determines that there is substantial public interest for a public hearing and that the public hearing will serve to clarify issues concerning closure of the tanks. If a hearing is to be held, a public notice stating the date, time and place of the hearing will be made at least 30 days before the hearing. After the close of the public comment period and after review of the comments, ADEQ will approve, disapprove, or modify the closure plan. All persons who comment, and additional persons who request in writing, will be sent a copy of the decision and any response to comments.
