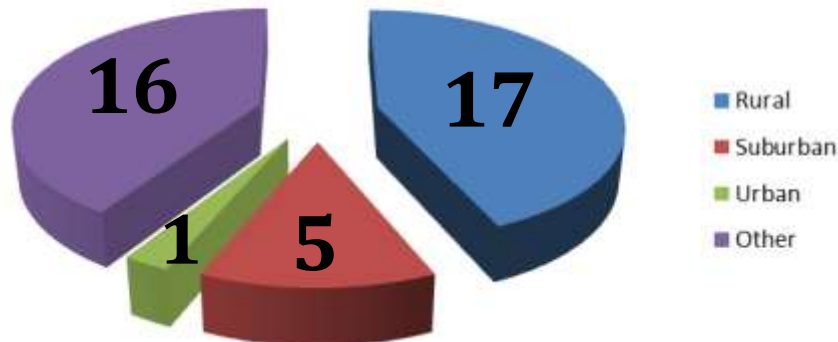

CITY POPULATION RANGES

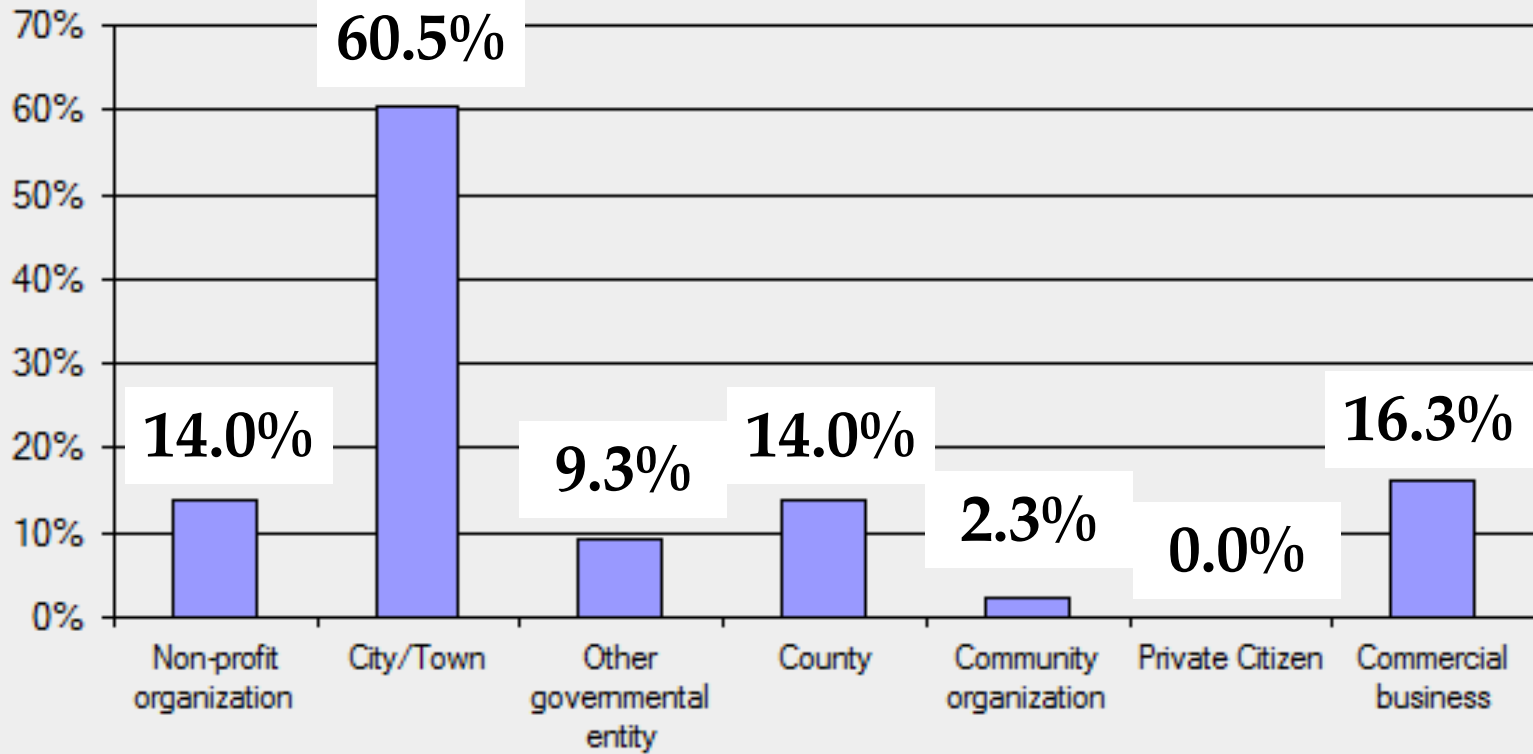

REDUCE REUSE RECYCLE

Be a responsible recycler and help preserve our environment!

YES

PAPER

- ✓ YES Newspaper, Magazines & Cardboard (including pizza boxes)

PLASTICS

- ✓ YES All Plastic Bottles
- ✓ YES All Plastic Containers
Preparation: Remove lids, rinse and flatten.

ALUMINIUM & STEEL CANS

- ✓ YES All types of Steel Cans
- ✓ YES All types of Aluminium Cans
Preparation: Rinse out all food scraps.

GLASS

- ✓ YES All types of Glass Bottles, Jars and Soft Drink Bottles
Preparation: Remove lids and rinse.

NO

- ✗ NO Window glass, blue glass, broken glass, ceramics, crockery, light bulbs or pyrex (ie. casserole dishes)
- ✗ NO Building materials
- ✗ NO Plastic bags
- ✗ NO Disposable nappies
- ✗ NO Garden waste
- ✗ NO Food scraps
- ✗ NO Syringes
- ✗ NO Waxed cardboard (ie. cream/milk cartons, juice cartons)

Putting incorrect items in your recycling bin can make your entire neighbourhood's collection NON-RECYCLABLE!
Please take care when separating your waste.

- DO NOT OVERFILL YOUR BIN
- THE LID MUST BE CLOSED

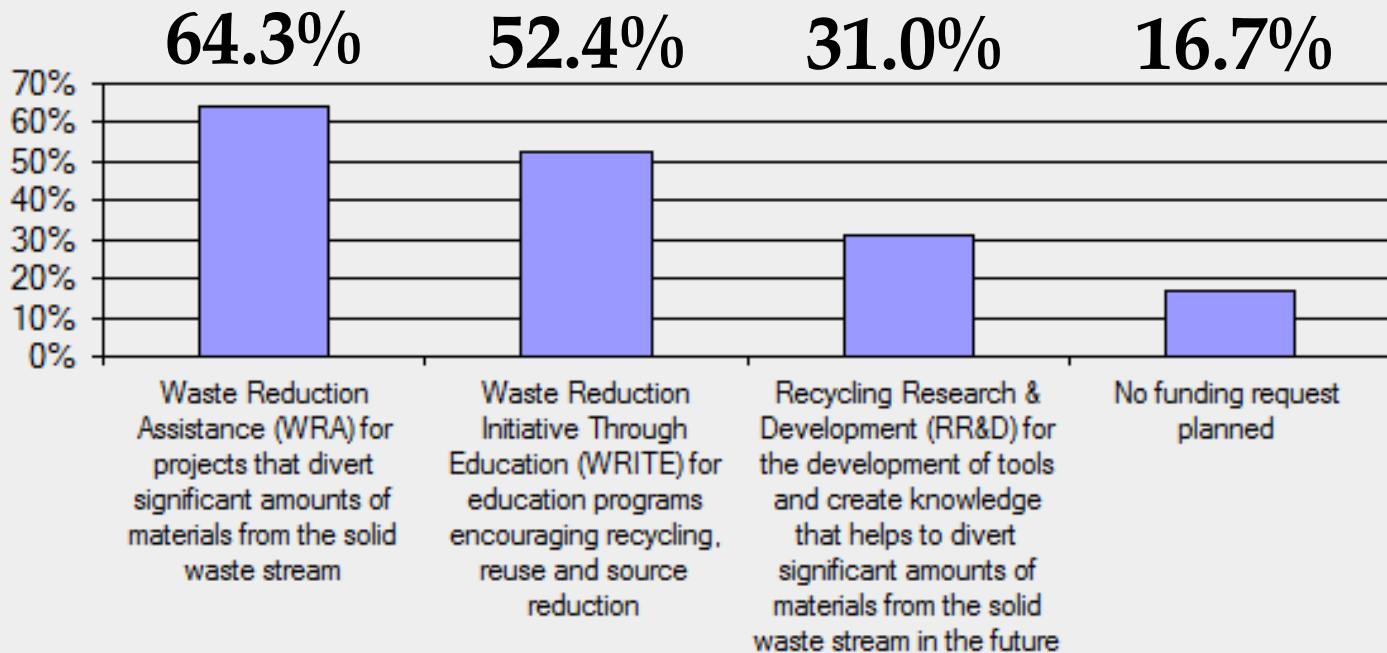
PAST GRANT EXPERIENCES

- ❑ Re-launched Tempe's Recycling Program
- ❑ Removal of Household Hazardous Waste was very successful for the Hopi Tribe's Environmental Program
- ❑ WRA funding program was impetus for providing seed money for Fountain Hills nonprofit corporation's environmental projects
- ❑ Keep Phoenix Beautiful finds the ADEQ recycling grant program critical to the improvement and expansion of recycling programs
- ❑ ADEQ grant funding helped with public education and getting our curbside trash and recycling program started
- ❑ El Mirage received a grant that successfully eliminated household hazardous waste
- ❑ Bullhead City used the ADEQ grant program to start a pilot recycling program that is still working great

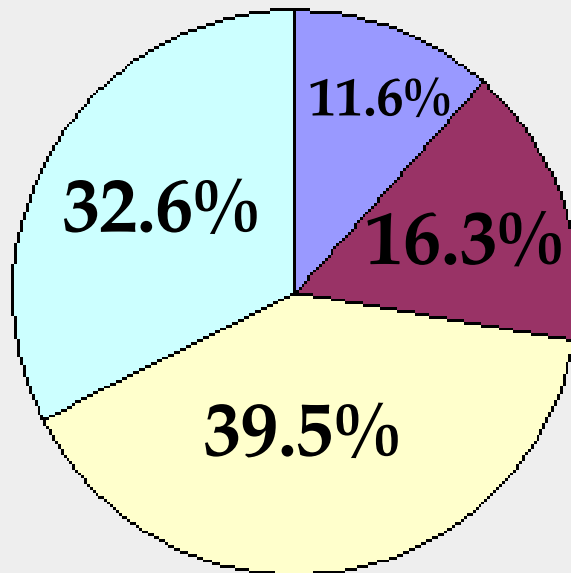


NEW FUNDING CATEGORIES

- ▣ Multi-City/Multi-Town-to encourage regional partnerships

MATCHING FUNDS

GRANT CYCLES

MULTI-YEAR: **74.4%**

- ▣ Able to have many phases (planning, implementation and maintenance)
- ▣ Sustain a program regardless of the economy
- ▣ Allow tracking the success

ONE YEAR: **25.6%**

- ▣ Time consuming to do each year
- ▣ Limits research
- ▣ Once program is a success the funding is gone
