## Definitions:

**Municipal solid waste** includes wastes such as durable goods, nondurable goods, containers and packaging, food scraps, yard trimmings, and miscellaneous inorganic waste from residential, commercial, institutional, and light industrial sources. Examples of waste from these categories include: appliances, automobile tires, newspapers, clothing, boxes, disposable tableware, office and classroom paper, wood pallets, cafeteria wastes, and all other post-consumer wastes.

**Non-Municipal solid waste** includes all wastes that are not considered municipal solid waste.

Examples of waste of this type include: construction and demolition debris, automobile bodies, municipal sludges, agricultural wastes, industrial sludges, industrial process wastes, and all pre-consumer wastes even though they might be disposed of in municipal landfills or incinerators.
