NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY OF THE FEASIBILITY STUDY WORK PLAN FOR THE WESTERN AVENUE WATER QUALITY ASSURANCE REVOLVING FUND (WQARF) REGISTRY SITE

The Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) has prepared the feasibility study work plan to implement the feasibility study for the Western Avenue WQARF Site in Avondale and Goodyear, Arizona (A.A.C. R18-16-404(C)(1)(d)). A feasibility study is conducted to identify a remedy and alternative remedies that appear to be capable of achieving the established remedial objectives.

The Western Avenue WQARF Site groundwater contamination plume is bounded approximately by San Xavier Boulevard (north of Western Avenue) to the north, 3rd Street to the east, State Route 85 to the south and the Phoenix Goodyear Airport to the west.

The Western Avenue WQARF Site was placed on the WQARF Registry in 1998 with score of 51 out of a possible 120 points. The scoring of a site, its relative score, or its placement on the Registry does not necessarily represent a determination that the release of a hazardous substance from the site poses a threat to human health or welfare or the environment.

Following the completion of the feasibility study as outlined in the work plan, ADEQ will prepare a proposed remedial action plan (PRAP) for the site. A notice will be issued and the public will have an opportunity to comment on the PRAP.
