

**NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY
SHANNON ROAD-RILLITO CREEK/EL CAMINO DEL CERRO
WATER QUALITY ASSURANCE REVOLVING FUND (WQARF) SITE
FINAL REMEDIAL INVESTIGATION (RI) REPORT**

The Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) has completed the final remedial investigation (RI) report for the Shannon Road-Rillito Creek/El Camino del Cerro Water Quality Assurance Revolving Fund (WQARF) site in Tucson, Arizona [Arizona Administrative Code R18-16-406(J)]. An RI is conducted to document the nature and extent of the contamination and the sources thereof; identify current and potential impacts to public health, welfare, and the environment; identify current and reasonably foreseeable uses of land and waters of the state; and obtain and evaluate any other information necessary for identification and comparison of alternative remedial actions.

The final RI report includes the final remedial objectives report and responsiveness summaries regarding comments, issues and concerns raised during the community involvement process.

The Shannon Road – Rillito Creek/El Camino Del Cerro WQARF site consists of a groundwater contamination plume located in Tucson. The plume is bounded approximately by West Rudasill Road to the north, El Camino Del Cerro Road to the south, the Meadowbrook Park to the east, and Camino de la Tierra and the Santa Cruz River to the west. The site consists of industrial and residential properties to the northeast of Interstate 10 (I-10). Also, the closed El Camino del Cerro Landfill occupies approximately 19 acres of land in the southwest portion of the site, north of El Camino del Cerro Road between the Santa Cruz River and I-10.

Contaminants of concern (COCs) in groundwater, soil or soil gas at the site include tetrachloroethene (PCE), trichloroethene (TCE), 1,1-dichloroethene (1,1-DCE), cis-1,2-dichloroethene (cis-1,2-DCE), and vinyl chloride.
