

PUBLIC NOTICE OF PROPOSED SOIL AND GROUNDWATER CLEANUP

In accordance with Arizona Revised Statutes § 49-1005.H and Title 40 Code of Federal Regulations § 280.67, the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) is providing notice that a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) has been proposed for the remediation (i.e., cleanup) of soils and groundwater that have been contaminated with petroleum as a result of a leaking Underground Storage Tank (UST) system at the following facility:

Multi-Phase Extraction System:

Existing soil and groundwater contamination at the referenced site will be remediated using a multi-phase extraction (MPE) system. During MPE, vapors and contaminated groundwater are withdrawn simultaneously from the contaminated area and treated at the surface, if required by applicable law. To evaluate the effectiveness of the MPE system, periodic monitoring of the contaminant levels being extracted will be required by the ADEQ. The site may be eligible for closure once contaminant levels decrease to below cleanup standards.

A copy of the CAP is available for review during normal business hours at the ADEQ Records and Library Review Area, 1110 W. Washington Street, Ste. 140, Phoenix, AZ 85007 and the Williams Public Library, located at 113 South 1st Street, Williams, AZ 86046-2596. ADEQ encourages public participation in UST corrective actions and welcomes comments on the proposed CAP. A public comment period is in effect from November 17, 2004 through December 24, 2004. Comments should be submitted in writing by December 24, 2004 to ADEQ/Tank Programs Division Corrective Action Section, SIRU II, and Attention: Charles Hallas, 1110 W. Washington Street, Phoenix, AZ 85007. If sufficient public interest has been demonstrated within 30 days of this notice, ADEQ will announce and hold a public meeting.
