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
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Brownfields Assistance Program



What are Brownfields?

Real property, the expansion, redevelopment, or reuse of which may be complicated by the presence or potential presence of a hazardous substance, pollutant, or contaminant.

What is the Brownfields Assistance Program?

Through the EPA, the State Response Grant is used to reimburse ADEQ for costs to manage the Brownfields Program, conduct outreach activities, and for state targeted site assessment projects. Additionally, applicants may apply to ADEQ for their sites to be part of the Brownfields Assistance Program. The program can provide financial and technical assistance for Phase I and Phase II Environmental Site Assessments or clean up.

Why is Brownfields Development Important?

Brownfields properties are often abandoned, with owners no longer maintaining the property or paying taxes. Abandoned properties can quickly become eyesores, and may attract vandalism and illegal dumping, which degrade the environment, depress our communities, and potentially put our health at risk.

What would be the Advantage of a Brownfields Revitalization Project in My Community?

Productively reusing Brownfields reduces urban sprawl, increases the tax base, cleans up the environment, encourages urban revitalization and creates jobs for the community.
