

Frequently Asked Questions

1. **Where do I get the product listing application?**

You may download the [application](#) from the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality web site.

2. **Where do I file my application?**

All product listing applications are reviewed by the Engineering Review Program located at the ADEQ Phoenix office. The submittal address is:

3. **What are the fees for Product Listing?**

The Engineering Review Program charges fees for the review of product listing applications. Effective July 1, 2011, an initial deposit of \$2,000.00 is required to begin the review of an application. Review fees are charged at the current hourly rate of \$122.00 per hour up to the maximum fee of \$15,000.00. All outstanding fees must be paid prior to ADEQ issuing the product listing.

4. **What does the ADEQ List of Proprietary Products include?**

The list of proprietary and other reviewed products may include manufactured systems, subsystems, or components within the treatment works and disposal works if the products significantly contribute to the treatment performance of the system or provide the means to overcome site limitations.

ADEQ has reviewed the products and services based on 3rd party performance demonstrations and finds that if properly installed, in suitable locations and properly maintained, these products and services meet ADEQ rules of protecting human health and the environment.

5. **What does the ADEQ List of Proprietary Products exclude?**

The Department will not list septic tanks, effluent filters or components that do not significantly affect treatment performance or provide the means to overcome site limitations.

6. **Are performance values assigned to products on the ADEQ List of Proprietary Products?**

Yes. The Department ensures that performance values on the list reflect the treatment performance for defined wastewater characteristics.

7. **What additional information is provided by ADEQ on the List of Proprietary Products?**

ADEQ includes any appropriate information on the applicability and limitations of each listed product.

8. Can a Notice of Intent to Discharge (NOI) application for a Type 4.23 General Permit be approved if the product is not on the ADEQ List of Proprietary Products?

No. An NOI can only be approved when the products used in the design are on the ADEQ List of Proprietary Products.

9. Does ADEQ endorse the products on the List of Proprietary Products?

The listing by ADEQ of any proprietary product or service is not an endorsement by ADEQ or the State of Arizona. ADEQ does not endorse, represent, guarantee, warranty or defend the use of any of the products or services. These product and service providers are a direct source unrelated to ADEQ or the State. Use of any listed product or service is at the applicants risk and the State assumes no liability.
