Highlights of the WQD Fees Draft "Strawman" Rule Proposal

The Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) has initiated a rulemaking to amend the fee rules for the Aquifer Protection Permits (APP) and establish fees for the Arizona Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (AZPDES) permits. ADEQ filed a notice of docket opening, published in the Arizona Register on August 27, 2010.

Through this draft "strawman" rule proposal, ADEQ is soliciting informal public comment until September 30, in advance of formally proposing the rules. After considering informal comments, ADEQ anticipates publication of the proposed rule by the end of October. Following publication, there will be a 30-day formal public comment period and ADEQ will conduct at least one oral proceeding for comments.

ADEQ is seeking to have these rules adopted and new fees established by May, 2011, in order to be effective by July 1, 2011 (the start of fiscal year 2012).

Background

ADEQ no longer receives legislative appropriations from the General Fund, and as a result has been authorized by the Legislature to establish these fees for APP and AZPDES through formal rulemaking (House Bill 2767, Laws 2010, 2nd Regular Session, Chapter 267). Assuming the fees within this draft "strawman" rule proposal, ADEQ is projecting revenues of approximately \$11 million will be derived and will be sufficient to sustain the APP and AZPDES programs.

Draft "Strawman" Rule Proposal Summary

The fees for the APP and reclaimed programs are currently found in A.A.C. Title 18, Chapter 14, Article 1. ADEQ is proposing to amend Article 1 by raising APP and reclaimed water fees and adding fees for the AZPDES program as well. Major changes in this rulemaking include:

- R18-14-101 Definitions Modifies several existing definitions, deletes some outdated definitions, and introduces several new definitions related to the AZPDES program. Also adds definitions for two new optional reviews related to APP Type 4 general permits (GPs).
- Section R18-11-102 Hourly Rate and Maximum Fees Hourly fees for APP and AZPDES.
 - WQD workload analysis established an hourly rate of \$122 for both the APP and AZPDES programs for those water quality protection services done under an hourly fee.
 - o Introduces an annual rate adjuster tied to an index in this case, the Consumer Price Index.
 - o APP maximum fees have been moved from statute to rule (Table 1).
 - New maximum fees have been proposed for AZPDES permits or activities charged an hourly rate (Table 2).

- Section R18-14-103 Initial Fees raises the initial fee submitted with an application subject to an hourly fee from \$1,000 to \$2,000 consistent with the new hourly fee of \$122/hr
- Section R18-14-104 Annual Fees for Individual APP and AZPDES Permits APP annual registration fees have been moved from statute into rule. New annual fees for individual AZPDES permits or programs are established in subsection (B) and Table 4.
- Section R18-14-108 APP Water Quality Protection Services Flat Fees Repeals FY11 fees for the APP program and creates a new section listing all the APP program flat fees and renewal fees including Type 2, 3 and 4 GPs and transfer of permit authorization. The Type 4 GPs are reorganized to better reflect how the program operates and processes permits.
 - O Type 4.01 GP sewer collection systems establishes fees based on design flow, rather than number of upstream connections under current rule. The fees are cumulative on a per component basis, with a maximum fee cap of \$25,000 for large projects.
 - O Type 4.23 GP establishes a base fee for an onsite wastewater treatment facility with flows of greater than 3,000 gpd but less than 24,000 gpd. Base fee covers up to 3 treatment or disposal works GPs and 2 onsite wastewater treatment facilities GPs. Each additional treatment or disposal design or additional system is \$500 up to maximum fee of \$7500. Establishes annual report fee as required in R18-9-E323(G)(2).
 - o All other Type 4 GPs Simplified the Type 4.02 4.22 GPs table currently in rule to distinguish between onsite systems and additional treatment or disposal technologies. Proposed rule establishes a base fee of \$1200 for the first Type 4 GP (the onsite system) that is not a 4.01 or a 4.23 GP. Each additional treatment works or disposal works is an additional \$500.
- Section R18-14-109 AZPDES Water Quality Protection Services Flat Fees This new section establishes flat fees for AZPDES GPs to allow fees for future AZPDES GPs according to specified categories.
 - Categories include MS4 phase 2, non-municipal stormwater discharges (such as the construction GP and multi-sector GP), non-stormwater discharges, emergency discharge, transfer, and biosolids land applicators.
 - o In assigning fee amounts to the categories, ADEQ considered factors such as population, acreage disturbed, or level of department effort over a 5 year period (including the number of hours it takes to develop the permit, process the application to provide coverage and to handle inspections and data management activities.)
- Section R18-12-110 Other Flat Fees This new section establishes flat fees for other non-APP, non-AZPDES specific program including drywell registration and transfer, and issuance of Certificates of Approval of Sanitary Facilities for Subdivisions.
- Section R18-14-111 Implementation This new section is on the implementation of these new fees

TITLE 18. ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY CHAPTER 14. DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY PERMIT AND COMPLIANCE FEES

ARTICLE 1. WATER QUALITY PROTECTION FEES

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ARTICLE 1. WATER QUALITY PROTECTION FEES

R18-14-101. Definitions

In addition to the definitions in A.R.S. §§ 49-201, 49-241.02, <u>49-255</u>, 49-331, and 49-362(I), and A.A.C. R18-9-101, and A.A.C. R18-9-701, <u>and A.A.C. R18-9-A901</u>, the following terms apply to this Article:

- 1. "APP" means an Aquifer Protection Permit.
- 1. 2. "Complex modification" means:
 - a. A revision of an individual Aquifer Protection Permit for a facility within a mining sector as defined in A.R.S. § 49-241.02(F)(2); and
 - b. A revision of an individual Aquifer Protection Permit for a facility within a dry well, industrial, or wastewater sector due to any of the following:
 - i. An expansion of an existing pollutant management area;
 - ii. A new subsurface disposal including injection or recharge, or new wetlands construction;
 - iii. Incorporation of an extensive compliance schedule into a permit;
 - iv. A discharge to the waters of the United States with the potential to impact the downgradient protective uses;
 - v. Submission of data indicating contamination, or identification of a discharging facility or pollutants not included in previous applications that requires reevaluation of BADCT; or
 - vi. Closure of a facility that cannot meet the clean closure requirements of A.R.S. § 49-252 and requires post-closure care, monitoring, or remediation.
 - a change in a facility, addition of a facility, or other revision to an individual APP that requires a significant amendment under A.A.C. R18-9-A211(B) or meets the definition in A.R.S. § 49-241.02(F)(1) for the mining sector.
- 2. "Owner or operator" means a person with a vested interest in real or personal property, or an authorized representative or agent of that person.
- 3. "Courtesy review" means:
 - a. A design review service the Department completes within 30 days, of the 60 percent specifications, design report, and construction drawings for sewer collection system; and
 - b. The applicant submits a Notice of Intent to Discharge for an APP Type 4.01 permit with final documentation within 180 days from the applicant's submittal of 60 percent documents.
- 4. "Priority review" means the Department's design review service for an APP Type 4 permit application using not more than 50 percent of the total review time-frame for the applicable Type 4 permit application.

- 3. 5. "Request" means a written application, <u>notice</u>, letter, or memorandum submitted by an applicant to the Department for water quality protection services. A request is made at the time it is received by the Department.
- 4. <u>6.</u> "Review-related costs" means any of <u>includes</u> the following costs applicable to a specific application:
 - a. Presiding officer services for public hearings on a permitting decision;
 - b. Court reporter services for public hearings on a permitting decision;
 - c. Facility rentals for public hearings on a permitting decision;
 - d. Charges for laboratory analyses performed during the application review, and
 - e. Other reasonable, direct, plan and necessary review-related expenses documented in writing by the Department and agreed to by an applicant.
- 5. "Significant Industrial Users" means the same as in 40 CFR 403.3(t).
- 6. "Site visit" means an inspection conducted before issuing a permit or approval.
- 7. "Standard modification" means an amendment to an individual Aquifer Protection Permit that is not a complex modification as described in A.A.C. R18-9-A211(C)(4) through (C)(7) and A.A.C. R18-9-A211(D).
- 8. "Water quality protection service" means:
 - a. Reviewing a request for a an APP determination of applicability;
 - b. Issuing, renewing, amending, transferring, or denying an aquifer protection permit, an AZPDES permit, or a reclaimed water permit;
 - c. Reviewing supplemental information required by a permit condition, including closure <u>for an</u> APP;
 - d. Performing a an APP clean closure plan review;
 - e. Issuing a Subdivision Approval Certificate of Approval for Sanitary Facilities for a Subdivision;
 - f. Registering or transferring registration of a dry well;
 - g. Conducting a site visit;
 - h. Registering a significant industrial user; or
 - i. Conducting an annual reclaimed water inspection.
 - h. Reviewing proprietary and other reviewed products;
 - i. Reviewing documentation related to an AZPDES general permit, including a notice of intent, notice of termination, certificate of no exposure, and waiver;
 - j. Registering and reporting land application of biosolids; or,
 - k. Pretreatment program review, inspection, or audit.

R18-14-102. Hourly Rate and Flat Rate Maximum Fees for APP and AZPDES Water Quality Protection Services

- A. The Department shall assess and collect an hourly rate fee or a flat rate fee for a water quality protection service, except for minor permit amendments specified under <u>A.A.C.</u> R18-9-A211(C)(1), (C)(2) and (C)(3) and A.A.C. R18-9-B906(B), unless a flat fee rate is otherwise designated in this Article.
- B. Hourly rate fees. Except as established under subsection (C), the The Department shall calculate the fee using an hourly rate of \$61 \$122, adjusted annually, multiplied by the number of review hours to provide a water quality protection service, plus any applicable review-related costs, up to the maximum fee specified under R18-14-104 in subsections (C) or (D).
 - 1. The Department shall adjust the hourly rate every July 1, to the nearest 10 cents per hour by multiplying \$122 by the Consumer Price Index for the most recent year, and then dividing by the Consumer Price Index for the year 2010.
 - a. The Consumer Price Index for any year is the average of the Consumer Price Index for allurban consumers published by the United States Department of Labor, for the 12-month period ending on December 31 of that year.
 - b. The Department shall publish the change to the hourly rate by March 31 of each year.
 - 4. <u>2.</u> The Department shall not charge an applicant for the first 60 minutes of Department preapplication consultation time costs for the project manager.
 - 2. The Department shall not charge the applicant travel time.
- C. Flat rate fees. The Department shall assess a flat rate fee for the following water quality protection services:
 - 1. Dry well registration, \$10 per dry well;
 - 2. Significant industrial user registration, \$250 per year;
 - 3. Determination of applicability, \$100 per request:
 - a. If the Department determines that an individual permit is required or that the applicant qualifies for a Type 2, Type 3, or Type 4 General Permit, the \$100 fee shall be applied to the final bill for the individual permit or to the flat rate fee for the general permit.
 - b. If the determination of applicability is completed as part of an area-wide permit issued under A.R.S. § 49-243(P), the fee for the individual permit applies.
 - 4. Subdivision approval. Approvals are granted in phases of 150 lots or less.
 - a. Sewage treatment and disposal is provided outside the boundaries of the individual lots, 150 lots or less, \$300:

- b. Sewage treatment and disposal will be located within the boundary of the lot, 40 lots or less, \$500; 41 to 150 lots, \$1000;
- c. The appropriate fee specified in (C)(4)(a) and (C)(4)(b) applies to each phase if a subdivision includes more than 150 lots.
- 5. Type 1 General Permits. No fee is required;
- 6. Type 2 and Type 3 General Permits.
 - a. New permit, expansion, and renewal fees, established in Table 1;
 - b. Transfer of ownership, \$50 per transfer;
 - e. If a site contains more than 1 facility covered by the same Type 2 or Type 3 General Permit and each facility is substantially similar in design, construction, and operation, the applicant shall pay the fee established under (C)(6)(a) or (C)(6)(b) for the first facility and one third of the fee for each additional facility.
- 7. Type 4 General Permits.
 - a. New permit and expansion fees established in Table 1 plus any of the following:
 - i. A request for an alternative design, installation, or operational feature, \$75 per change;
 - ii. A design requiring an interceptor, \$100 per interceptor;
 - iii. A site visit verifying a construction deviation, \$150 per site visit.
 - b. If an onsite wastewater treatment system is based on a design that combines elements from more than one Type 4 General Permit, the applicant shall pay the greatest fee established in Table 1 for the appropriate Type 4 General Permit; \$250 for each additional general permit used in the design, and any additional fee specified in subsections (C)(7)(a)(ii), (C)(7)(a)(iii), and (C)(7)(a)(iii).
 - c. Transfer of ownership, \$50 per transfer for the first Type 4 General Permit.
- D. The Department shall not review a request for a water quality protection service if:
 - 1. The initial fee established in R18-14-103 or flat rate fee established in subsection (C) has not been paid, or
 - 2. The owner or operator has an outstanding water quality protection service bill not under appeal.
- C. Maximum fees for a water quality service related to an APP are as follows:

R18-14-103. Initial Fees

- A. Except for annual reclaimed water inspections, an An applicant shall submit a \$1000 \$2,000 initial fee for each water quality protection service subject to an hourly rate fee established under R18-14-102(B) A.A.C. R18-14-102 at the time an application is submitted to the Department for review.
- B. If requested by an applicant, the Department may set a lower initial fee when the Department estimates a review fee that is less than the applicable initial fee.
- C. The Department shall not review a request for a water quality protection service if the applicant or permittee has not paid any fee required under this Article, unless the applicant or permittee has an outstanding water quality protection service bill which is under appeal.

R18-14-104. Maximum Annual Fees for Individual APP and AZPDES Permits

- A. Maximum fees for Aquifer Protection Permit actions.
 - 1. Maximum fees for individual Aquifer Protection Permits, complex modifications, standard modifications, clean closures, and denials shall be determined as prescribed under A.R.S. § 49-241.02(A) and the hourly rate specified under R18-14-102(B).
 - a. The public shall have an opportunity to comment on factors used to obtain the maximum fee.
 - b. The Department shall list the maximum fees in an Annual Fee Schedule which shall be published in the Arizona Administrative Register by June 1 of each year, except for FY01 when it will be published by January 1, 2001.
 - 2. When an application is deemed administratively complete, the Department shall notify the applicant of the applicable maximum fee for review of the application. The maximum fee will be the lesser of the effective maximum fee determined under subsection (A)(1) or the applicable maximum fee specified under A.R.S. § 49-241.02(B).
 - 3. Unless the applicant has been previously noticed, the Department shall issue a supplemental notice specifying the maximum fee for a pending project deemed administratively complete before January 1, 2001.
- B. Maximum fees for Reclaimed Water Individual Permits. The Department shall charge no more than

\$16,000 for review of each reclaimed water individual permit application.

A. Annual Registration Fees. The annual registration fee required under A.R.S. § 49-242 is in Table 3:

R18-14-105. Fee Assessment and Collection

A. Billing. The Department shall bill an applicant for water quality protection services no more than monthly, but at least quarterly. The following information shall be included in each bill:

- The number of hours of the review (excluding hours for travel time and the first 60 minutes of
 pre-application consultation time for the project manager) accrued by employee position type by
 activity and subactivity code during the billing period, and the effective hourly rate for all
 activities;
- 2. A description and amount of each review-related cost incurred for the project;
- 3. The total fees due and paid and the maximum fee for the project; and
- 4. A description, by date, of each water quality protection service performed.
- B. Annual reclaimed water inspection. If the Department conducts an annual reclaimed water inspection, the owner or operator shall pay the final itemized bill within 30 days from the date on which the final inspection report and final itemized bill are mailed to the owner or operator.
- C. B. Final bill. After the Department makes a final determination whether to grant or deny a request for a permit or an approval, or when an applicant withdraws or closes the application, the Department shall prepare a final itemized bill for an application review.
 - 1. If the total fee exceeds the amount of the initial fee plus all invoicing, the Department shall issue a final itemized bill for the cost of the water quality protection services up to the applicable maximum fee established under R18-14-104 A.A.C. R18-14-102.
 - 2. If the total fee is less than the initial fee and all paid invoicing charges, the Department shall refund the difference to the applicant.
 - 3. Fees for water quality protection services shall be paid in U.S. dollar by cash, check, cashier's check, money order, or any other method acceptable to the Department.
 - 4. The Department shall not release the final permit or approval until the final itemized bill is paid in full.

R18-14-106. Reconsideration of a Bill; Appeal Process

- A. A person may seek review of a bill by filing a written request for reconsideration with the Director.
 - 1. The request shall specify, in detail, why the bill is in dispute and shall include any supporting documentation.
 - 2. The written request for reconsideration shall be delivered to the Director in person, by mail, or by facsimile on or before the payment due date or within 35 days of the invoice print date, whichever is greater.
- B. The Director shall make a final decision on the request for reconsideration of the bill and mail a final written decision to the person within 20 working 60 days after the date the Director receives the written request.

R18-14-108. Water Quality Protection Fees for Fiscal Year 2011

- A. Beginning on July 1, 2010 until June 30, 2011, the fees listed in Table 2 increase and supersede any fee listed otherwise in this Article or in A.R.S. Title 49, Chapter 2, Article 3.
- B. In addition to the annual registration fee required under A.R.S. § 49-242 for Calendar Year 2010, a one time increased annual registration fee as listed in Table 2 shall be due within 30 days of the invoice postmark date for the increased fee.
- C. This Section and Table 2 will repeal automatically, effective July 1, 2011 Table 2.

R18-14-108. APP Water Quality Protection Services Flat Fees

- A. The Department shall assess a flat rate fee for an APP water quality protection service listed in this Section.
- B. Type 1 General Permits. No fee is required, except as stated in A.A.C. R18-9-A304(A)(2).
- C. Type 2 and Type 3 General Permits.
 - 1. A new Type 2 General permit authorization or expansion is \$600; a renewal fee is \$200
 - 2. A new Type 3 General permit authorization or expansion is \$3,000; a renewal fee is \$1,000
 - 3. Transfer of permit authorization is \$50 per transfer;
 - 4. If a site contains more than one facility covered by the same Type 2 or Type 3 General Permit and each facility is substantially similar in design, construction, and operation, the applicant shall

pay the fee established under subsection (C)(1) or (2) for the first facility and half of the fee for each additional facility.

- A. The Department shall assess a flat rate fee for an AZPDES water quality protection service, as described in Table 5.
- B. In addition to the requirements in A.A.C. R18-9-A907(A), a draft permit will state what category and fee it is assigned to and the factors considered, according to Table 5. Any interested person may comment on the fee level assignment during the public comment period described in A.A.C. R18-9-A908.

C. Annual Fee. The Department shall bill an annual fee to permittees who have not filed a notice of termination for an applicable general permit.

R18-9-110. Other Flat Fee Rates

Flat rate fees. The Department shall assess a flat rate fee for the following water quality protection services:

- 1. Dry well registration, \$100 per dry well;
- 2. Dry well transfer of registration, \$50 per transfer;
- 3. Certificate of Approval for Sanitary Facilities for Subdivisions.
 - a. Subdivision with public sewerage system is \$600 for every 150 lots;

- b. Subdivision with individual sewerage system is:
 - i. \$500 for less than ten lots, or
 - ii. \$1,000 for less than 50 lots, and
 - iii. \$1,000 for each additional 50 lots.
- c. If water from a central system is not provided to the lot, the fee is one and one-half the applicable fee stated in subsections (a) or (b).
- d. Condominium subdivision is \$1,000 for every 150 units.

R18-14-111. Implementation

The fees in this Article apply on the effective date of these rules. For fees related to the AZPDES program, a person shall submit the applicable fee for:

- 1. A request for a water quality protection service when specified in an AZPDES General Permit or in 18 A.A.C. 9, Article 9; and
- 2. The annual fee for an AZPDES general permit, even if the person filed for coverage before the effective date of these rules.
